King George County Schools, in partnership with Germanna Community College, will be implementing a positive teen group for twelfth grade students in the 2019-2020 school year. This program will be open to any senior regardless of plans after high school.

Purpose

- To prepare students for life after high school through development of life skills
- To develop skills that will improve relationships with families, friends, and teachers
- To promote healthy development in the areas of self-esteem, relationships, decision making, problem solving, coping and stress management, and communication

GCC proposes an after school and summer enrichment program addressing the following topics:

- Surviving and Thriving
- Cooperation and Communication
- Responsibility and Discipline
- Building Courage and Self-esteem
- Drugs, Sexuality, and Violence

KGCS teachers, counselors, and administrators will work with students and families to refer students. Small and large group discussion, role playing, activities, film clips, and self-reflection will be utilized.

- One day per week, from 2:45 – 4:00 PM
- Six sessions per cohort during the school year
- Summer enrichment program will be one week, dates and times TBD
- KGCS will provide space and a co-facilitator/supervisor
- Transportation options are under discussion

An Alternative to Suspension focusing on Emotional Intelligence

King George County Schools, in partnership with Office on Youth (OOY) and Spotsylvania County Schools, will be implementing an alternative to suspension for students in Grades 7 – 12 for the 2019-2020 school year.

VOISE is a 4-hour workshop focused on emotional intelligence (EI), which consists of self-awareness, self-regulation, empathy, social skills, and motivation. Evidence shows that in schools that employ EI practices, anti-social behaviors go down, pro-social behaviors go up, and academic achievement goes up.

VOISE stands for:

- **V**ocal choice (self-awareness and self-regulation)
- **O**wnership (self-regulation and accountability)
- **I**ntelligent decision-making (self-regulation and motivation)
- **S**ocial skills
- **E**mpathy

KGCS administrators will work with students and families to refer students to VOISE in lieu of out of school suspensions.

VOISE will give participants tools to enable them to assess and improve their behavior management plan along with skills in using their voice in a productive and effective way. Small and large group discussion, role playing, activities, film clips, and self-reflection will be utilized in VOISE.

- Saturday mornings 8:00 AM – 12:30 PM
- 2 days a month in Spotsylvania, 1-2 days a month in King George
- Reciprocity agreement between divisions
- Up to 8 students per session
- KGCS will provide space and a co-facilitator/supervisor
- Transportation options are under discussion
